- Immediately reportable diseases are responded to and investigated immediately 100% of the time.
- 24 hour reportable diseases are responded to and investigated on the same day, or on the next day 100% of the time.

*Since December 2020, Confirmed cases of Novel Coronavirus 2019 (SARS CoV2) have decreased slightly although total numbers of cases have increased. This is likely due to the increase in Negative test results, resulting in cases classified as Not a Case.
