- Immediately reportable diseases are responded to and investigated immediately 100% of the time.
- 24 hour reportable diseases are responded to and investigated on the same day, or on the next day 100% of the time.

\*Since February 2021, Confirmed cases of Novel Coronavirus 2019 (SARS CoV2) have increased by nearly 1,000 and almost doubled. Total cases reported of Novel Coronavirus 2019 have increased by over 1,000 cases, and the positivity rate has increased by about 3% since the previous month (Feb. 2021).

\*Although vaccination rates have increased and more individuals are vaccinated in our communities, many people have spent more time outdoors and together with the weather getting warmer. This could account for a more drastic increase in COVID-19 cases for March 2021.
