  Performance Management for Immediately Reportable and 24 Hour Reportable Communicable Disease:
  - Immediately reportable diseases are responded to and investigated immediately 100% of the time.
  - 24 hour reportable diseases are responded to and investigated on the same day, or on the next day 100% of the time.
    - \*Included in this report are MCRHC towns and Middletown.
    - \*Since April 2021, Confirmed cases of Novel Coronavirus 2019 (SARS CoV2) have decreased by about 80%. Total cases reported of Novel Coronavirus 2019 have also decreased by about 80%. Of the COVID-19 test results reported for the MCRHC jurisdictions (including Middletown), 98% are Confirmed positive.
    - \*Currently, more individuals are vaccinated than before, in Monmouth County and in NJ. This could account for the great decrease in COVID-19 Confirmed cases for May 2021.
    - \*MCRHC has seen a slight increase in non-COVID communicable disease cases for May of 2021, in all categories but for Tick-borne and GI illness in particular.
