 Performance Management for Immediately Reportable and 24 Hour Reportable Communicable Disease:
 - Immediately reportable diseases are responded to and investigated immediately 100% of the time.
 - 24 hour reportable diseases are responded to and investigated on the same day, or on the next day 100% of the time.
 - *Included in this report are MCRHC towns and Middletown.
 - *Since July of 2021, Confirmed cases of Novel Coronavirus 2019 (SARS CoV2) have increased by 89.1%. Total cases reported of Novel Coronavirus 2019 have increased by 49.2%. Of the COVID-19 test results reported for the MCRHC jurisdictions (including Middletown), 54.1% are Confirmed positive.
 - *Currently, more individuals are vaccinated than before, in Monmouth County and in NJ. However, the sharp increase in the Delta variant has contributed to the increase in positive cases in both unvaccinated as well as vaccinated individuals. The percent positivity in our jurisdiction is higher for August 2021, as there are more people testing positive. However, there are also more people that tested in general (reports received).
 - *MCRHC (and Middletown) has not seen much change in the numbers for non-COVID communicable diseases for August of 2021. The fluctuations are minimal since the previous month. .
