  Performance Management for Immediately Reportable and 24 Hour Reportable Communicable Disease:
  - Immediately reportable diseases are responded to and investigated immediately 100% of the time.
  - 24 hour reportable diseases are responded to and investigated on the same day, or on the next day 100% of the time.
    - \*Included in this report are MCRHC towns and Middletown.
    - \*Since June of 2021, Confirmed cases of Novel Coronavirus 2019 (SARS CoV2) have increased by 77.2%. Total cases reported of Novel Coronavirus 2019 have increased by 88%. Of the COVID-19 test results reported for the MCRHC jurisdictions (including Middletown), 51% are Confirmed positive.
    - \*Currently, more individuals are vaccinated than before, in Monmouth County and in NJ. However, the sharp increase in the Delta variant has contributed to the increase in positive cases in both unvaccinated as well as vaccinated individuals. The percent positivity in our jurisdiction is lower for July 2021, due to the increase in testing and reports received at the LHD.
    - \*MCRHC (and Middletown) has seen a slight increase in non-COVID communicable disease cases for July of 2021, in all categories but for Lyme disease in particular.
